A different event, the "SmallSat Conference" is held annually in August in Logan, Utah, USA, however, that conference is mainly focused on technical info provided by universities and the US Air Force. The SmallSat Symposium, is instead, focused on business aspects of the industry, in



order to provide a foundation for the rapid growth seen in the small satellite market today. The nature of this symposium is nicely summarized within a phrase in the logo - "The Small Satellite Business & Finance Show".

As this was the first SmallSat Symposium, we had noticed a 'wait-and-see' attitude amongst the host and attendees. Not all startup companies in the field attended, but one could certainly call the event a success, as 200 people participated, and full capacity was reached soon after sign up commenced. Among the participants, we saw business people, investors, entrepreneurs, and some engineers. The organizers announced their intent to hold next year's symposium at a larger site. The two events will co-exist, with the "SmallSat Conference" focusing on technical aspects, and "The SmallSat Symposium" focused on business.
